Highlights of Board of Trustees Meeting Tues, August 24, 2021

Opening Day: The Board discussed Opening Day celebrations which were held virtually on August 30, 2021. Administrators and staff were encouraged to gather at their respective schools to partake in the day's activities which included keynote speaker, Anthony McLean and six breakout sessions. Topics covered were: numeracy, literacy, wellness, anti-racism, assessments and indigenous foundational learning.

COVID Update and Return to School Plan: Palliser School Division circulated our re-entry plans to school administration. Our re-entry plans give individual schools latitude within certain parameters to decide what they will require of students this year. Of primary concern is masking. Masking will not be necessary in areas where schools have reduced crowding. Schools are being recommended to create cohorts of students during indoor student learning and indoor extracurricular activities, where possible, particularly for students who are unable to be vaccinated (kindergarten to Grade 6). The division released our re-entry plans by email as well as updated the website and social media channels following this meeting. Individual schools will be facilitating individual re-entry plans to parents and students later this week.

Update since meeting: Alberta Health has enacted a new health order effective September 4, 2021. Palliser updated the Palliser COVID-19 School Guidance plan accordingly and sent a letter home to all parents on September 7, 2021

Field Trips: The Board discussed a previous motion which was made at the outset of COVID-19 indicating that all international travel and field trips be postponed. Since then, some schools within the district have indicated that they would like their students to partake in international travel and field trips. It was also noted to the Board that the government of Canada has indicated that field trips are now permissible within individual Cities and Canada. Due to these changes, the previous motion was amended. Field trips within our province and Canada will be permitted; however all international trips sponsored or undertaken by any school entity under the Palliser School Division and for students and staff will be cancelled or postponed until further notice.

Coaldale Project: The Board discussed the new school project in Coaldale. The project is currently underway, and a temporary road will be added to the site later next week so that it can be staged and equipment can be delivered. The Palliser School Division has tendered piles as well as some of the foundation work. In October 2021, the steel will be tendered, as it is very difficult to order and obtain. At the end of October 2021, the rest of the sub-trades will be

tendered. The Board and Division would like to thank Grant Hunter, MLA and Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Education for being instrumental in moving this project forward.

Update since meeting. Members of the Board, along with our Superintendent attended the Ground Breaking Ceremony in Coaldale on September 10. The town of Coaldale Councillors and Mayor were present as well as members from the Legislature, residents of the town, and Media.

❖ Staffing:

- ➤ We have two kindergarten classes again this year. Heather Meehan is the kindergarten teacher but is currently on medical leave. Katie Wade is filling in for her for now.
- ➤ We have Heather Bianchini, Tia Giesbrecht, and Lauren Stelten (soon to be Mrs. Taylor) teaching grade ½.
- > Lucy Thompson is teaching grade 3.
- Sarah Beagle, John Dyck, Lori Helland and Ashley Warren are teaching grade /. Lori is teaching art to everyone from K-6 in the afternoons so Ashley takes Lori's class for ELA in the afternoons. Sarah Beagle will be going on maternity leave at Christmas break.
- Mrs. Kirk is still here half time to look after our learning support.
- > Mrs. Helland is teaching art to everyone from K-6.
- Mr. Rodgers is normally our music teacher but he is currently on a medical leave. While he is away, Mrs. Marilyn Newbury was hired to teach music to our grade 1 to 6 students two half-days per week (Tuesday afternoons and half of Friday mornings).
- ➤ Mrs. Inaba is teaching French to everyone in grades 4-6.
- Miss Angela Hill is our Family School Liaison Counselor. They are still working on her schedule but we are hoping that she will be in our building for a half day each day. Our Making Connections Worker (Miss Breanna Taylor) resigned over the summer and we haven't been able to find a replacement for her. Our MCWs typically work in classrooms to help our students with such things as organizational skills, friendship skills, coping skills, leadership, etc. as well as supporting families and referring them to services in the community. Angela (and hopefully our new MCW) will be working at VPE, CCHS, Arrowwood School, and Milo School. If your child needs a referral, please see Tracy.
- Our custodians this year are Mac Burnay (our head custodian who is at the school during the day keeping everything sanitized) and Kim Kwasnecha (who is our part-time custodian who does more of the deep cleaning in the evenings.)
- > We were able to maintain about the same number of EA hours for our school.

2. Behaviour program - Restorative Practices

Research tells us that the most effective behaviour support program for schools is a restorative practices model. At the end of August, staff spent 2 days in training on this program and we are working on implementing this in our school this year. It takes time to develop and refine but we are hopeful that it will develop a culture where students have a voice, students are held accountable for their actions and atone for their mistakes, and students feel safe and supported.

- people of all ages are happier, more cooperative, engaged and productive, more likely to make positive changes when those in authority do things with them, rather than to or for them
- schools can adopt practices that provide both high standards and high support
- relationships change when we move away from blaming, stigmatizing, excusing or rescuing and use more positive language
- staff are empowered to respond effectively to classroom disruptions to end interpersonal conflict or minimize behavioural and relationship problems"
