Meeting Called to Order - 6.47

Agenda presented

Minutes from Sept meeting were presented - Toby moved the minutes as read. Motion Passed Tracy Inaba – Principal report – please see attached

Comprehensive school threat assessment guidelines-

Schools were using a zero tolerance approach and have moved to CSTAG model -School Threat Assessment Decision Tree. Allows school to take into consideration context. Team effort that will go through a process to decide on intent and consequences

Tom Hamer – Deputy Superintendent- explained the CSTAG model. The Palliser Division has shifted to this new approach this year.

Various parents have asked questions relating to how the system works. When and how fast these processes will happen. Who is informed and when. The resolution process. Level of threat / situations

Parents expressed issue with the process being followed unfairly

Tom Hamer has acknowledged a lack of communication at all levels –

There is recognition that this all takes time and effort on the parent side

Recognition of the time and effort for the parents to come tonight. It shows a level of
concern in the community for the kids at the school

If you believe there is a serious threat situation call the police

Please sit down with your kids and explain to them how to deal with a threatening situation. Kids are encouraged to talk to a trusted teacher, find a parent, and they can also call home.

Tracy explained the new restorative practices system

System is being evaluated and the results are not always evident to the parents

<u>How to escalate concerns</u> – First point of contact should be the teacher and principal. If you feel the issue is not addressed, please escalate it to Tom Hamer (email contact at the top of these minutes) If Tom does not address your concerns, please escalate it to the Superintendent. From there it could go to a review board and possibly the ministry of education.

Immediate action has been promised to some of the concerns raised.

It has been asked that teachers are made immediately aware of situations so they can better address parent concerns

It has been asked what level of threats would warrant a notice to go home to parents It has been asked that timely and appropriate communication improve on all levels

It has been promised that information on all concerns will be forthcoming and Tom Hamer will be back to the November meeting to address the concerns and will be available for all meetings this year if need be to restore faith in the school community and provide some accountability

Can Parents volunteer in the school? Current focus is on keeping kids safe. New guidelines are coming in today regarding new government announcements. Covid not going away, how can we adapt and be flexible. 18 months have passed since we started down this path and what is the path forward. Parent / children feeling the disconnect especially with the younger kids whose parents have never been in the school.

Are rural schools rated the same as city schools? – city cohorts are much larger than our whole school. This year lock down is not as strict and the cohort definitions may allow for some requests. Palliser definition is that each school is unique and can provide some flexibility

Prairieview School Council Meeting October 5, 2021 Highlights of Board of Trustees Meeting Tues, September 28, 2021

Truth and Reconciliation Day: Palliser School Division schools engaged in awareness activities related to nature, empathy, relationships, and Blackfoot language with Orange Shirt Day, landing on different days throughout the week for our schools. During the week of September 27, students in Huntsville School for example, engaged in a variety of school-wide activities, including a Medicine Wheel Feather Art Project where students collected twigs and sticks to make a multi-media medicine wheel. As well, students participated in a nature walk, where they recorded observations from an Indigenous perspective. Divisional school, RI Baker, in consultation with Elder Bruisedhead, honoured National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on October 1, by giving the school a secondary Blackfoot name. Following the ceremony, students have now been given the opportunity to take the information and what the name stands for, and create a Blackfoot school logo. This Blackfoot name and logo will be displayed throughout the school for students to reflect on throughout the year.

In addition to observing the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, schools across the Division continued to participate in Orange Shirt Day, as a way to honour residential school survivors who did not survive and their descendants. This day was used as an opportunity to engage in meaningful conversation as a way to come together and recognize past transgressions towards Indigenous people.

COVID-19 Update: The Palliser School Division continues to monitor the COVID-19 situation across our schools. As AHS is no longer identifying nor following up with individual close contacts of confirmed COVID-19 cases, and quarantine for close contacts is no longer mandatory, the Division has started notifying families and school communities of reported cases of COVID-19 in our schools. We are monitoring school attendance and reporting instances to AHS where absenteeism due to illness on any given school day exceeds 10% or greater. Where absenteeism of 10% or greater has been identified by AHS due to illness, AHS is investigating and may declare an outbreak and recommend additional voluntary measures. The Palliser Guidance document was updated on September 22nd outlining specific requirements for cohorts, physical distancing, drop-off and pick-up procedures, masking, field trips, and performance activities.

The Board and administration thanked both trustees for their guidance, hardwork and insight that they have provided to our division over the years.
