
Our Context

Make opportunities for teachers to observe one another in the classroom. Use the data from the math assessments to identify students who need interventions in areas of mathematics and address the gaps using a Response to Intervention structure.  The use of research-based reading and writing skills in classes. Using strategies and tools from Heggerty, Lively Letters, and The Science of Reading Strategies. Employing reading rotations, word work, interventions, and parent volunteers as part of literacy instruction. Direct reading instruction, small groups, and guided reading Small group support with younger grades to help with targeted literacy skills and address learning gaps. Writing workshop format used in classroom instruction. Provide PLC and site-based PD time to build capacity with staff in their understanding of research-based best practices in numeracy through an action research project, particularly in the area of decoding.
